

# “*The Spirit of Missions*” 立教 (St. Paul’s) 関連記事目録

## I．収録範囲

1. 「“*The Spirit of Missions*” 立教関連記事目録」は、アメリカ聖公会（Protestant Episcopal Church in USA）の伝道機関誌“*The Spirit of Missions*”（月刊）における立教関連記事を網羅的に収録した。
2. 収録範囲は、アメリカ聖公会が日本伝道を開始した1859年から“*The Spirit of Missions*”が終刊する1939年12月までを対象とした。
3. タイトル中に「St. Paul」がなく、別タイトルであっても、「立教」及びの「立教」の教育に関連する事項は収録した。
4. 立教の前身と考えられ、後に合流した男子校（例、St. Timothy’s School＝大阪英和学舎）関連は収録したが、アメリカ聖公会が設立した女子校（照暗女学校・平安女学校 [St. Agnes’ Girls School]、立教女学校 [St. Margaret’ Girls School]）は収録しなかった。
5. 収録作業は立教大学図書館新座保存書庫所蔵のマイクロフィルムから行った。明治末期（1912年）までの関連記事は、アメリカ聖公会文書館（Archives of the Episcopal Church）所蔵の“*The Spirit of Missions*”によって同作業をおこなった大江満氏の監修に依拠した。

## II．構成・配列

1. 巻号・年代順に配列した。

## III．記載の内容

1. 記載の順序は、原則として、リールの番号、巻号、刊行年月、タイトル、著者（ある場合）、ページとした。そして必要な場合には、注記事項をその後に記載した。
2. 出版年は西暦だけを表記した。
3. 年代によって“*The Spirit of Missions*”の編集方針に相違があるが、当目録のタイトルの区分は、大きな項目（例、Report of the Foreign Committee）をまず記載し、次の項目があれば（例、The Japan Mission）を記載し、最後に個々のタイトル（例、The Average Attendance at the Boys’ School）を記載した。その際の区分にコロンとセミコロンを使用した。（例、Report of the

Foreign Committee: The Japan Mission; The Average Attendance at the Boys' School. pp.783-784.)。コロんとセミコロンは領域をあらわす記号として使用し、文章の記号としては使用しなかった。直後の頭文字は大文字にした。また、タイトルの大きな項目には、「Editorial」、「Board of Managers」、「Domestic Department」、「Foreign Department」＝「Foreign Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church」、「Woman's Work」等がある。立教関連記事は、その殆どが前提となる「Foreign Department」、「Foreign Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church」にあらわれるため、これらの項目は省略した。また、「Foreign Department」、「Foreign Missions of the Protestant Episcopal Church」に続く「Japan」も省略した。省略して意味不明になる場合はこれを残した。

4. タイトルの後に、副署名がある場合、これを記入した。
5. タイトルの後に、見出しがある場合、人名等重要と思われる場合、これを記入した。
6. 別タイトルで立教関連記事が存在する場合、まず別タイトルとそのページ数を括弧内に記入し、続いて立教関連の関連文章を記入、その際、頭を「…」で示し、もしその文章が継続する場合、その文章の後に「…」を付し、該当ページを記入した。またその文章はイタリックで表記した。(例1: Editorial: Our Foreign Missions, (pp.362-363): *It is a source of sincere gratification .. for a new building for St. Paul's School in Tokyo is one of the immediate Wants.* p.362. 例2: Report of the Foreign Committee: Japan, (pp.644-647); Tokio, *The two boarding school at Tokio, St. Paul's for boys ..* p.645.
7. 2行にわたる場合、2行目は1桁下げた。
8. 目録中の [ ] は補記を示す。(例: [By] C. M. Williams)
9. 図、写真はページ数の後、[Illus.], [Photo(s)]を補記した。
10. 年代によって記載の仕方に相違があるが、大文字、小文字等統一がとれるよう配慮した。このため記事タイトル、主要関連部分は、代名詞、助動詞、前置詞、接続詞、冠詞の文字の最初を小文字にし、それ以外を大文字にした。引用の文章は原文に従った表記を原則とした。
11. 人名の後の称号等 (D.D.) は1こま開けずに記載した。(例: the Right Reverend Charles H. Brent, D.D.)
12. 「Appendix」でそれまでのページ数と連続しない場合、「(A)p.1」と記入に、さらに「(A)p.1」とも連続しない場合、「(Ap)p.1」と記入した。
13. ページ付は、「p.1.」であらわし、ページが連続する場合は、「pp.1-3.」とし、2件の記事をまとめた際は、「pp.1,3.」と記入した。
14. ページ付がない場合、リール内のナンバー (丁) を記載した。
15. 正規のページ付でないページ付も、角括弧 ([ ]) で囲んで記載した。(p.[22])
16. 月日の書き方は、「March」「Mar.」、「Sept.」「Sep.」。「3」「3d」「3rd」と表記は様々だが、原文のまま記入した。
17. 「Right」「Rt.」、「Reverend」「Rev.」等、敬称に略語を使用している場合とそうでない場合があるが、原文のまま記入した。
18. 「Tokio」「Tokyo」等も原文のままとした。
